Where does the money go?



Vets' fees for sick/injured animals

Around 200€ for initial treatment of severe cases of Leishmania + continuing treatment at a lower rate
(Currently 3 ongoing cases)

Emergency sterilisations

(Average 120€)

Food for street animals

Dog food - 25-30€/20kg bag

Would feed one large dog around 1 month

Cat food - 28€/20 kg bag

Re-homing animals in Germany

Large dog

Travel box
up to 200€

Inoculations/microchip/Passport/flea & worm treatments
95€

Blood test re Leishmania (dogs older than 6 months)
30€

Transport to airport (fuel)
50€
(Assuming volunteer's car)

Car hire if no volunteer car
70€

Air fare
Minimum 40€

Re-homing animals in Germany ...continued

Puppy or cat/kitten

Travel box
up to 100€

Inoculations/microchip/Passport/flea & worm treatments
95€

Transport to airport (fuel)
30€

(Assuming volunteer's car)

Car hire if no volunteer car
30€

Air fare
Minimum 20€

Additional costs incurred are mainly to do with travel boxes not being returned, or coming back damaged.

Working closely with the Arche Noah Charity, through which homes are found for animals, helps to avoid excess costs as much as possible.

Around 60 dogs have been found new homes in Germany this year, despite the economic crisis. However it has been harder than ever to find homes, especially for adult animals.

Several adult dogs have been taken into foster care in Germany.

This gives them a greater chance of finding a new home, which is better for them, and we do not have to pay for their "upkeep" here.

The number of adult animals being abandoned has risen sharply this year, thus increasing the burden on the charity. These animals are caught and sterilised whenever possible, to reduce future numbers, but they still need to be fed throughout the winter until there is a chance of rehoming them in the summer months next year.
